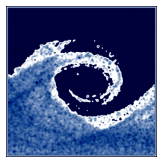


Laboratory tasks

1. Perform simulation of an airfoil.

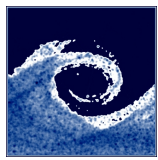

cp -r $FOAM_TUTORIALS/incompressible/simpleFoam/airFoil2D $FOAM_RUN
cd $FOAM_RUN/airFoil2D
# Study files with ls, less, find, etc.
checkMesh > log.checkMesh.1
renumberMesh -overwrite >log.renumberMesh
checkMesh > log.checkMesh.2
# Study the log files!
meld log.checkMesh*
# Study the difference!
simpleFoam > log.simpleFoam.1
# Study new files with ls, less, find, etc.
# Study the solver logfile!
tail log.simpleFoam.1
# Note that the solution is converged.
```

2. Create a changeDictionary file to change flow velocity.

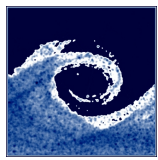

3. Change boundary condition and continue simulation.

changeDictionary
meld 350/U*
# Find all differences!
simpleFoam > log.simpleFoam.2
# Study the solver logfile!
tail log.simpleFoam.2
# Note that the solution is NOT converged.
cp system/controlDict system/controlDict.org
sed -i 's/500/1000/' system/controlDict
meld system/controlDict*
simpleFoam > log.simpleFoam.3
# Study the solver logfile!
tail log.simpleFoam.3
# Note that the solution is now converged.
paraFoam
```

4. Visualize streamlines for the two converged solutions!

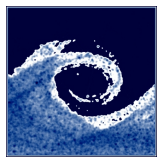
- Stream tracer, Line source, Y axis
- Time = 350 s and 783 s

5. Plot residuals and number of iterations using gnuplot!

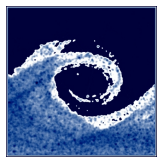

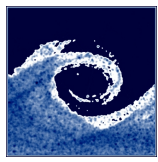
6. Perform a simplified motorbike simulation and visualize results.

Assignments

2. What are the dimensions of field p in the *airFoil2D* case?
3. What is the average of velocity magnitude over the inlet patch in *airFoil2D*?
4. What is the integrated volume flow over the inlet patch in *airFoil2D*?
5. What are the dimensions of field B in the *mhdFoam* tutorial called *hartmann*?
6. Is the lift coefficient positive or negative for $(15 \ -3 \ 0)$ freestream velocity in *airFoil2D* case?



Homework

1. Read OpenFOAM UserGuide chapter 3.5-3.7.
2. Perform *motorBike* simulation again at home. Try to create better visualization in ParaView, save colourful images and send images to teachers by e-mail.
3. Use sample utility to post-process results of *motorBike* simulation. You can read OpenFOAM UserGuide chapter 6.5 if you need help. Use gnuplot to create png images of profiles.
